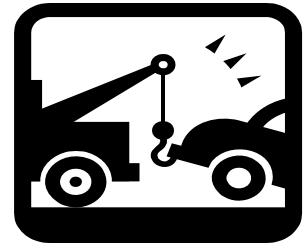
2007 Vehicle Forfeiture Summary by Sergeant Dellwo

In 2007 the Shakopee Police Department seized a total of 50 vehicles pursuant to the forfeiture statutes. DWI violations accounted for 38 of the seizures while drug offenses totaled six and designated offenses like burglary, fleeing, and fraud accounted for the remaining six.

We successfully forfeited, or entered into forfeiture agreements, on 46 vehicles in 2007. This total includes vehicles that were seized in 2005, 2006 and 2007. DWI offenses were once again the most frequent violation accounting for 31. Drug offenses accounted for six and designated offenses totaled nine.

The dispositions of the 46 vehicles included:

- Sale at auction (14)
- Junked (8)
- Returned to lien holder due to loan exceeding value of the vehicle (4)
- Termination due to a plea to a lesser charge (5)
- Returned to registered owner per forfeiture agreement (14)
- Retained for police department use (1)



The proceeds of the above 2007 dispositions totaled \$20,499.40. The Police Department's 70% share total was \$14,349.58.

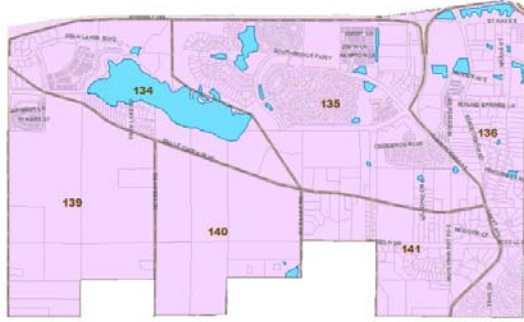

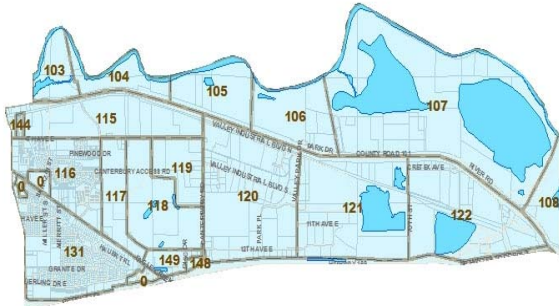
